St. Brigid's wins 2nd novice meet

St. Brigid's came out on top of a close point dual with Northeast and Blessed Sacrament in the novice skating meet at Emerson Park Sunday afternoon.

Skaters from St. Brigid's picked up 29½ points to squeak past Northeast (39) and Blessed Sacrament (38) for the school trophy. Northeast was defending champion after a novice indoor rink meet earlier in the season.

The meet, sponsored by the Midland Speed Skating Club and the Department of Parks and Recreation, saw 88 competitors and 17 schools represented.

Trophies were awarded to first place winners in each class, based upon total points in three races for each class. Ribbons were awarded to second and third place finishers in each race.

Races in twelve age divisions were staged, though in the older ages few were entered. Points were awarded on the basis of five for first place finishes in each race, three for second two for third and one for fourth.

Toddler and Pony classes (through nine years) raced 50, 75 and 100 yards, while Midgets and Juveniles raced 100, 220 and one-sixth mile distances. Juniors, Intermediates and Senior ran 220, 440 and sixth-mile.
