From the Principal's Desk

This past Monday marked 100 years of Catholic education at Saint Brigid Catholic School. Time and time again, as you read the school's history, the school faced challenges that forced the school to create a plan, persevere and overcome. The desire for the community to have a school first created a challenge to collect funds to build the first school. Overcrowding led to a



need for expansion. An increase again in enrollment led to a need to create makeshift classes in the gym. A decline in Catholic school in the 60's threatened the existence of many Catholic Schools. Saint Brigid brainstormed about financial and marketing means to keep the school open. We saw a repeat of each of these issues as the new building was built. Finally, to these challenges we added COVID, a flood and teacher shortages.

If you read the history of the school, three things stand out to me as constants:

First and foremost is our faith. Initially, the teaching of our faith was something done by the religious sisters for fifty years. Lay teachers continued to build on the foundations of faith laid by these sisters. Our priests and deacons added to those layers with their teachings. Layer by layer, we have built a Catholic presence that shines through our weekly masses, Circle of Prayer, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program and our daily religious classes. Prior to every meeting and every event at the school, we begin with prayer. We begin and end each school year in prayer. God has certainly led us through 100 years of Catholic education.

The second thing that stands out to me is our community. Through each issue we have faced, it took a community of people to dream, pray it and create it into existence. It is that same sense of community that I felt on Sunday as I watched people help to plan, set up, run, and tear down the picnic.

The third thing that I noticed as I read the history and is that we have had and continue to have an incredibly talented and dedicated staff. Staff members helped to run the picnic Sunday and then retreated to their classrooms to continue to plan, to clean up after the picnic or to ready technology, the library, and after school programs for students. Our staff accepts the role as a mission and their dedication to the success of each student is obvious.

As I watched the kindergarteners, the first class of the next 100 years, enter the building Monday, I wondered

Requirements for Volunteering in the School

Volunteers make the school function well and we welcome any and all volunteers. However, in order to ensure the safety of our students, the following are requirements of the Diocese which need to be completed **<u>before</u>** coming into the school to volunteer in any capacity, including chaperoning field trips and attending classroom parties:

- Complete Standards of Ministerial Behavior & Background Check Paperwork (from Parish Office)
- Complete VIRTUS training (in-person every 6 years; online every 3 years)
- Get fingerprinted at the Midland Police Department on Thursday mornings from 9-11am (only one time)

Scrip Program

Do you and your family eat? Do you buy gas? Then you can and should participate in our SCRIP Gift Card Program. SCRIP is a gift card program that allows you to purchase a gift card at its value and earn money for both the school and for you! It is the PTO's main fundraiser of the year. If you purchase a \$100 Meijer gift card, for example, Meijer gives 3% or \$3 back to the school. After you earn \$100 for the school, 75% of everything you earn comes back to you in the form of a tuition credit, hot lunch credit or rebate. Not only that, but the cards may be purchased by you, your neighbor or a relative! It is a win-win-win program! Spirit Days and School Spirit Wear Days


