The school year is well underway and with it have come a few challenges. For various reasons, it took longer for the state to approve our Spanish teacher. As a result, I taught middle school Spanish for the first few weeks of school. We have also had a number of students and staff absent due to illness. As a result I have taught Middle School Math and First grade. Teaching all of your beautiful children has been a wonderful reminder to me of how important a Catholic education is to our young people.



Thanks to the fact that we are teaching within a Catholic School, we can begin and end each class in prayer. In our Spanish class, I taught the middle school students the sign of the cross and the Glory Be in Spanish. Because we have smaller class sizes, we can strongly encourage all students to take risks. A class like Spanish requires students to speak, listen, read and write in Spanish. In a large class, it would be challenging to provide feedback to every student. However, in our class, I could provide feedback and encourage students to try to say things, even if they didn't feel confident about their answers.

Middle School Math is always an area that challenges students. However, the students that I worked with were eager to try and figure out the answers because they have been taught how to think about math and how to set goals for themselves.

Teaching our first graders was especially heartwarming. These young students are so eager to learn and to show you what they know and can do. They are eager to help each other to figure things out. And they are eager to share what they have with other students. It is easy to see why Jesus wants us to be like the little children.

The Culture of Reading


What is "to read"? It is an action in which we enter "in communion" with someone else. Recognize that every book has *a person* behind it, with whom we have the chance to develop a relationship. The idea of a "habit of reading" implies it is not something easy or mechanical. It is almost a synonym of the "habit of listening": it must be cultivated. "To read" means the will "to listen" to the author.

Why read?

Why would we want to "enter in communion" with somebody else?

- To learn something
- To enjoy something together, to share
- To get out of myself, "my way", "my like": an experience of goodness

We must select contents that have real value (respect for language and the good, the true and the beautiful): that make our time worthy.
