From the Principal's Desk

Volunteers. Do you know that a quick calculation of common volunteer needs at our school gave me the number 138 as the minimum amount of volunteers needed to make school events run smoothly. Today, our student counts stands at 131. That means that *every* family is needed in order to make our school run smoothly and efficiently.



In today's world, we have become very busy. Most of our families have two parents working. Time is precious. It is easier to show support for things and for people by writing the check than by showing up. So why do it? Why do we volunteer?

There are many practical reasons for volunteering. Studies have shown that when we do for others, we reap the benefits in terms of lowering our own stress levels and experiencing joy can elevate our moods. Also, from a practical perspective, it saves resources. If one volunteer was paid for helping in the cafeteria daily for 1.5 hours x \$10 an hour x 40 weeks, it would cost the school \$600 to have that person in place. And we have 131 such places- some requiring more time than others. Volunteering strengthens community and builds relationships with staff, students and other parents. And volunteering shows our children how to be civically-minded and responsible.

But our faith teaches us that volunteering is important for reasons beyond these. Jesus was the ideal servant leader. He didn't do for others because we were deserving of it. In fact, He gave His life for

Digital Academy

We have had a few parents reach out about not receiving emails being sent from Digital Academy. The default is set for parents to receive a weekly recap email on Sundays of any missing assignments, absences, tardiness, or discipline writeups. Digital Academy has communicated that those update emails should start this Sunday. They may be delivered to your spam/junk mail so please check there. If you would like to change your notification settings, you can easily do that. After logging in, there should be a down arrow in the upper right corner by your name. Click that and then "Notification Settings". Here you can change the type and frequency of notifications that you would like to receive.

Teachers (4th-8th) have just begun to input assignments and grades into Digital Academy so there may not be any for the time being. When you log into your parent account, you will see a box in the upper right corner named "Assignment Digest" if there are assignments input for your student. From that box, you can click and see open assignments an recently graded assignments for your student.
