# **ICLE Updates**

As you know, Saint Brigid is partnering with the Institute for Catholic Liberal (Arts) Education. As a result, we are changing little things in the way that we present lessons to students. It has been remarkable how many of these strategies have become student favorites. For example, Fable Fridays is a part of the sixth grade English/Language Arts curriculum. For some lessons, students are given two fables and they are to compare and contrast both the stories and their meanings. Sometimes, they are used in Socratic Circles where students read and then discuss the stories and decide on the morals while the other group observes and comments on the discussion itself. Sometimes, they read the fable as a read aloud and use one of a reader's theater approach. Other times they discuss character traits and virtues. Fable Friday is a favorite among many. Ask your middle schooler about it!

# To Read with Fluency and Comprehension A Child Needs:

**Auditory Perception** 

- Listening with sustained attention
- Ability to discriminate sounds, rhythms, patterns
- Sequential auditory memory-narrative ability

Symbolism-Verbal Skills: Vocabulary

- Comprehension-understanding of concepts expressed in words
- Verbal reasoning
- Understanding that a mark, sound, a pattern represents an object or idea
- Print awareness

#### Update Regarding Scouting at St. Brigid

Pack 3768 is changing Chartered Partners after a 26 year relationship with St. Brigid Catholic Church. This change is happening due to a desire to charter a Trail Life USA group at St. Brigid, as their integration of faith in the program better aligns with the mission of the parish. Although the Catholic Church has no official concerns with BSA, early in 2023 the Saginaw Diocese indicated to parish leaders that they not renew charter agreements into 2024. An amended charter will allow units to maintain relationships with Catholic parishes, such as Troop 798 at Blessed Sacrament. The amendment to the charter came after plans had already been set in motion at St. Brigid to sponsor a Trail Life unit in 2024. In order to make the recharter process as seamless as possible, St. Brigid has released the charter for Pack 3768 and Chestnut Hill Elementary PTO will assume the charter this month. This is not an excommunication of scouting from St. Brigid. Updates will be provided periodically to the school newsletter and scouts will be welcome to celebrate Scout Sunday at their home church, including at St. Brigid.
