From the Principal's Desk

Last week we had a security site assessment (for which, as an aside, we did very well). I had an interesting talk with the retired police officer that did it about the challenges of students and social media. I said that social media exposes students to many things that they are not yet ready to see or to know about. He said that the bigger problem is that students feel that they need to look perfect, dress perfectly, have perfect hair, say all the right things because, at any moment, someone may photograph or record a video of them that will be shared for all to see. Students, he said, are quick to point out others'



mistakes in this way. Trying to be perfect creates a ton of anxiety. This literally gave me goosebumps to hear. How much stress this creates for our young ones and how many of them are looking at our model of phone/screen addiction and are getting screens at a younger and younger age.

But this is not limited to our young people. I belong to a Facebook group called Ask Midland where people frequently ask questions like "What are the current road conditions?", or 'What places in town have the best _____?', or 'What should I do if I am having these symptoms....?' Though there are many that give helpful suggestions, I regularly see posts where people are just vicious in their responses. It seems that we, as a society, are just waiting for someone else to make a mistake so that we can point it out. It reminds me of the story where Jesus asks the one without sin to cast the first stone. If we can be honest with ourselves, we are all

Re-enrollment Begins Soon!

Re-enrollment for current students will begin on Monday, January 8, 2024. This year all registration forms will be through Digital Academy (hooray for no more paper/pencil copies!) so an email link and instructions will be sent out when enrollment is open. There will be ONE form that will have to be completed on paper and returned to the office before registration is complete, that is the Parish-School Contract. In the past, only MACC parishioners outside of St. Brigid had to have the form signed by their parish priest but starting this year, even St. Brigid parishioners will need to obtain Fr.
