Re-enrollment for Next Year

The Parent-Parish Contact form will still need to be completed on paper since it has to be signed by your Parish priest before turning into the office. If you are a member of St. Brigid Parish, Fr. Andy will need to sign your contract in person before your registration is fully complete. We ask that you complete your forms as soon as possible.

Tips from the Reading Specialist

More Tips for Supporting Reading Skills at Home

Help children sound out words smoothly. Sounding out a word involves saying the sound of each letter or letter combination one by one until the end of the word, and then saying them all together again quickly.

Help children sound out words by:

- Showing how to say each letter sound in a word, starting at the left-hand letter and moving right, and then joining all
 the sounds together to form the word.
- Stretching and connecting sounds together as much as possible.
