From the Principal's Desk

Spring is a time of new beginnings. The rain we had for the last couple of weeks has made the grass green again. Leaves are emerging on the trees and flowers are blooming. Water is essential for life.

Today, I had the opportunity to observe kindergarteners in the atrium as they learned about Baptism. The leader asked why water is important. Students answered that you can drink it, it makes things grow and it washes things clean. Water nourishes us and cleanses us. The leader (Bailey), showed



students the white garment. She asked students why it was white. They said because it was bright. Some said it was light. It reminds us that the light of Jesus is in us.

Then the students learned that water is poured over the child three times- one each for the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The child is anointed first with the oil of the Catechumens to symbolize strength. Then they are anointed with the Sacred Chrism, which has a sweet smell and shows that we are given the sweetness of Jesus.

The child receives light from the Paschal (Easter) candle as another sign of the light that is within them.

This lesson lasted about six minutes but it carried with it such meaning and created a sense of joy in the students. It is no wonder that many students then chose this work during their time.

This spring is a good time for us to reflect on our Baptism and how we are called to continue to live in the light and follow our Baptismal promises. We need only to look around to see what water can do. What has water done for you?

5th-8th Grade School Musical



Tips from the Reading Specialist

More Tips for Supporting Reading Skills at Home...Continued

Have conversations before, during, and after reading together. Having conversations when reading with children helps them develop higher level thinking and language skills, such as predicting, problem solving, or contrasting. While reading books aloud, ask the child questions and talk about the content of the story together before, during, and after reading.

- Use open-ended questions to ask the child to think about the book's messages and what is happening.
- Ask the child to apply the book's messages to the world around him by connecting events to his own life.
- Ask more and more complex questions, so the child continues to build her vocabulary and language skills. (from What Works Clearinghouse)
