From the Principal's Desk

As October approaches, most of us think of Fall and Halloween. But this month, I invite you to think of Our Lady of the Rosary. Our students will soon be making rosaries. The word rosary itself means a crown of roses. When we pray the prayers of the Rosary, we invite Mary, Jesus, God the Father, and the Holy Spirit into our thoughts and prayers. Beads are used to count the prayers; in Old English, the word



bead means prayer. Our Lady appeared to Saint Dominic in the 1200s and, upon regular praying of the rosary, he converted many people. Pope Pius urged Christians fighting the Ottoman Empire in the 1500s to fly flags with Christ on the cross. The Christians were victorious. Then Mary appeared to three children in Fatima and asked them to pray the rosary for peace.

Our Lady of the Rosary intercedes on our behalf for us. She serves as protector and guide. She is a model of

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Consecration of our School to Our Lady of the Rosary

On Friday, September 27th our school will say a prayer to begin the novena to seek the intercession of Mary, under the title of Our Lady of the Rosary for guidance, protection, and blessings upon our students, staff and families. We ask that families join us in this Novena (scan QR code below). On Monday, September 30th beginning at 9 AM, Sr. Philomena and the Sisters of Mother of Divine Mercy will be here to make chaplets with all students K-8. Then on the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary, Monday, October 7th, we will consecrate our school to the Blessed Mother under this title. We invite the entire school & parish community to join us for this special Mass, consecration, and reception on that day. Mass will be at 8am and the consecration & reception will immediately follow.

In order to commemorate this consecration, a framed image of Our Lady of the Rosary will be installed in the lobby of the school along with a prie-dieu where students can write their intentions and ask the Blessed Mother's intercession.

Fr. Stephen is moved to consecrate our school to the Blessed Virgin Mary for three reasons: 1) entrusting ourselves Mary is the surest and easiest way to holiness. He desires, and knows God desires, that our school be a place that leads our students to holiness and, ultimately, heaven. 2) The prayer of consecration to the Blessed Mother involves the renewal of baptismal promises. Through our partnership with ICLE, St. Brigid School is involved in a renewal of Catholic education, the grace that comes with a renewal of our baptismal promises will give us the spiritual boost to make the renewal a reality. 3) he believe Catholic educational institutions are at a crossroads in our Diocese of Saginaw. There are so many factors that threaten the flourishing of our Catholic schools in the future. By consecrating our school to Mary, we can be certain that whatever the future may hold, she will bring about God's will.

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The Reading Corner

I am excited to be your new reading specialist here at St. Brigid School!

In this first installment the 2024-25 'The Reading Corner', we will start at the beginning of reading – with sounds! First some definitions:

Phonological Awareness is an umbrella term that includes awareness of: individual words in sentences, syllables in words, rhymes, beginning and end of words, and phonemic awareness.

Phonemic Awareness is a subset of phonological awareness that targets individual sounds (phonemes) in words. With good phonemic awareness students can isolate sounds in words, blend sounds to make words, segment words into individual sounds, and change/add/delete sounds in words.

Phonics is when we attach a sound of spoken language to a written letter/group of letters.

Most kids learn about the sounds of language simply by listening to others talk. The awareness of individual sounds in words (phonemic awareness) is a stepping stone to reading.

When learning about sounds, it is important to present students (even babies!) with blendable sounds. Some consonant sounds can be tricky, as we tend to add a vowel sound (usually 'uh') to the end of our production, and we wind up with 'b-uh' instead of a short /b/sound. Other consonants such as 'r', 'w', and 'y' are tricky, because we all learned them as 'ruh', 'wuh' and 'yuh'. (To practice, choose a word that begins with your target sound, *start* to say the word and quickly stop. For example, say water without saying 'ater').
