## From the Principal's Desk

On Friday, Donald Maloney and I got to eat lunch with students from 3-8th grade. It was a great time to get to know students better. But I noticed something. Some students ate lunch alone. I made a point of sitting with those students and making conversation. Then I told the others that it is important to invite students into your circle sitting together. With a gentle nudge, I have noticed students starting to do so. It is a reminder that we all want to be



included, but trying to get into that inner circle is tough for some. It is part of our call as Catholic Christians to evangelize. Part of the way we do that is by living out Christ's example in our own lives. Are we inviting others in or do we keep others out? Matthew 5:16 reminds us, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." We can evangelize, then, simply by the way that we let our light shine.

I do not care for election time. I notice that some people, caught up in their views of the election, make a point to point out their opponent's flaws in very un-Christian ways. Similarly, it has become part of the norm for TikTok and YouTube to feature teens "roasting" people or groups of people and I hear students sometimes trying out this same language. Let us take time when we hear such things to

let our children know why this is unacceptable and how they can work to bring people closer together rather than exclude them.

Remember that Christ Himself chose to eat with the tax collectors and sinners. This means that we, too, are called to extend a lot of grace to those around us, even when they are different, rather than being quick to point out their differences. It means that we should meet people where they are and include those who have not been included!

If you are a returning parent, you can set an example for students by reaching out to new parents at pick-up. All parents can talk with their students about how to include others at lunch, at recess, and in class. Our staff can continue to provide ways for students to include each other and to praise students when we catch them including others. When students come home, ask them, "What did you do to include someone else today?" What a difference we can make!

#### Instead of asking your student, "what did you do in school?", try these instead:

- How do you say "Hello" and "My name is" in Spanish (grades 2-8)
- What a virtue is and what our virtue for September is... (grades K-8)
- What our September memory verse is... (grades 3 and up)
- What a timeline shows us (grades 1 and 2)
- What are the continents? (grade 3)
- What does a scientist do? (K)
- What did you do to include someone else today? (K-8)
- First graders are growing alligators, measuring, observing, and recording observations. Ask them what they have noticed.
- Ask your fifth grader about nature journaling!

#### <u>Classroom Updates</u>

• 6th grade students are adding tabs to their new Bibles and both 6th and 7th grade students are beginning the Encounter Bible Study Program:

Encounter is a Catholic Bible study designed specifically for grades 6 to 8. Using the color-coded Bible Timeline Learning System, each session of Encounter reveals the story of our faith and God's plan for our lives. Encounter is much more than your average Bible study program. It is a life-changing experience that speaks directly to the hearts and minds of middle school-aged kids. As your students are drawn into this story, they will come to a new and profound understanding of who God is. Most importantly, they will come to know God not as a distant doctrinal concept, but as a loving Father who desires a meaningful and lasting encounter with them.

- 7th and 8th grade students are exploring the 9 methods of prayer of St Dominic and 8th graders are beginning an in-depth study of the 12 Apostles and the Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
- After School Care students were wonderful after the Tornado warning. The students had practiced a tornado drill 18 minutes before the alarm sounded for the "real deal". Great job, ASC!

#### Coffee with the Principal

#### **Student Council Elections**

Campaigning for Student Council Officers begins on September 10th! Posters need to be approved by Mrs. Graves before they can be hung up throughout the school. Fifth grade students who are running will be required to give a speech on Tuesday, September 17th and then elections will take place immediately afterward. All students, 1st-5th grade will vote for the officer positions. Officer positions include President, Vice President, Secretary, and Marketing (previously Treasurer).

In grades 1st-4th, teachers will hold elections or selections with all interested students on Wednesday, September 18th. Permission slips should have already come home so please reach out to your teacher if you need another one.

#### Requirements for Volunteering in the School

Volunteers make the school function well and we welcome any and all volunteers. However, in order to ensure the safety of our students, the following are requirements of the Diocese which need to be completed <u>before</u> coming into the school to volunteer in any capacity, **including chaperoning field trips and attending classroom parties**:

- Complete Standards of Ministerial Behavior & Background Check Paperwork (from Parish Office)
- Complete VIRTUS training (in-person every 5 years-upcoming trainings available at virtus.org)
- Get fingerprinted at the Midland Police Department on Thursday mornings from 9-11am (only one time)
