Consecration of our School to Our Lady of the Rosary

We are praying a Novena in preparation for the Consecration of our School to Our Lady of the Rosary on Monday, October 7th at 8 AM. In order to commemorate this consecration, a framed image of Our Lady of the Rosary will be installed in the lobby of the school along with a prie-dieu where students can write their intentions and ask the Blessed Mother's intercession.



Fr. Stephen is moved to consecrate our school to the Blessed Virgin Mary for three reasons: 1) entrusting ourselves Mary is the surest and easiest way to holiness. The Reading Corner

October is DYSLEXIA AWARENESS MONTH

Dyslexia is "a learning disability that is neurobiological in origin" (www.dyslexiaida.org). In other words, Dyslexia is a physical difference in the brain.

• Human brains were not 'built' to read – and not everyone has the brain connections to easily translate sounds to the letters we attach to them

- 1 if 5 people have signs of dyslexia
- Dyslexia is NOT seeing letters backwards
- Dyslexia IS difficulty processing information (like letter / sounds) differently than 'typical readers' do.
- Dyslexia can be hereditary
- Dyslexia is NOT an indicator of intelligence
- People with dyslexic brains can also have difficulty with math/numbers, handwriting, difficulty with focus / impulsivity.
- DYSLEXIC BRAINS CAN BE 'REWIRED', but will always work differently than a non-dyslexic brain.
- People with dyslexic brains do not lack intelligence, their brains just work differently.
- Some famous dyslexic folks:
 - ◊ Albert Einstein, Steven Speilberg, Walt Disney, Henry Ford, Steve Jobs
 - ♦ Henry Winkler (the Fonz) * he wrote a series of books under the pen name Hank Zipzer that feature a dyslexic student and his (mis)adventures in school.
