From the Principal's Desk

I love that we remember all those who have passed away during the month of November. This is particularly poignant for me since November 12th is my father's heavenly birthday. In addition, we start this month with All Saints' Day, followed by All Souls' Day. We are called to remember all saints, both with a capital and a small s.

Google defines a saint as someone who espouses the virtues (temperance, prudence, fortitude, justice, faith, hope, and love) and is seen as a model for their faith. We are working on teaching the virtues because we are all called to be virtuous. What's more, we are called to be saints. We are called to be models of our faith to others.

We are called to be holy. That is easy to say but harder to do. Part of why I find it difficult is that I have too many things to do and too many tasks pulling me in different directions. The challenge is to find holiness in those tasks. We teach our students in middle school to pray before we begin each class. What is the purpose of this prayer? It helps us to find holiness in that next hour, to be fully present, to find the awe and wonder of the moment. In doing so, learning about science becomes a holy pursuit. It would be wonderful if we, as adults, could model this each day. Take time throughout the day to stop and pray, for yourself, and for others. In that way, we could make the little moments holy. It is no coincidence, also, that we remember and celebrate vocations—what is it that God is calling us toward—religious life, married life, single life? When we stop and take time to pray, we can hear His call.

Britni Burks, our Veterans Day speaker reminded students to learn their Bible verses. It was these verses that helped her through difficult times. I often find myself singing the bible songs of my youth. I think I was in college before I realized that many of those
